Penalty on breach

It is an offence to engage in any activity that you are prohibited from doing by this Order.

Depending on the behaviour in question, the enforcing officer could decide that a fixed penalty notice (FPN) of up to £100 would be the most appropriate sanction. The FPN may be issued by a police officer, PCSO, council officer or other person designated by the council. Should a Fixed Penalty Notice not be issued, West Midlands Police and Birmingham City Council may consider that further interventions are necessary to address the alleged behaviour.

Right to Appeal

In accordance of Section 66 of the Act, any interested person who wishes to challenge the validity of this Order may appeal to the High Court within six weeks from the date upon which this Order is made.

What you can do

Public Space Protection Orders are there to protect the community. If you see anyone breaking these conditions, inform the police on **101**.

A Public Space Protection Order is now in force in your area

A Public Space Protection Order is now in place in the Bartley Green Ward (and an area of Quinton Ward). This Order is in force from **4 February 2016**.

It has been identified that there are a number of activities carried out in this area that are having or are likely to have a detrimental effect including:

- The illegal and anti-social use of motorbikes, quad-bikes and scrambler bikes in public spaces, excluding the public highway.
- Anti-social behaviour caused by groups of young people and young adults in public spaces.

The following prohibitions will be enforced within the public spaces shown on the map overleaf:

- Groups of three or more people engaging in activities which are likely to cause nuisance, annoyance, harassment, alarm or distress. Including, but not limited to verbal abuse, damage to property including graffiti or vandalism, nuisance from vehicles, littering drug or alcohol related activity, violence or threat of violence.
- 2. Using a mechanically propelled vehicle in an illegal and/or an anti-social manner. This includes, but is not limited to mini-motos, motorbikes and guad bikes.

The order will be in force for a period of twelve months and will expire on **3 February 2017** (unless extended).

Public Space Protection Order Bartley Green

The areas included in this order are:

 Woodgate Valley including Woodgate Country Park and the adjoining neighbourhood enclosed by Sommerfield Rd and Stonehouse Lane (and including all adjoining roads).

- Sennelleys Park
- Shenley, including the neighbourhood enclosed by Moors Lane, Shenley Lane, Woodcock Lane and Cromwell Lane.
- LeyHill and surrounding areas
